

## **DON BOSCO COLLEGE, GOLAGHAT**

Saint John Bosco, popularly known as Don Bosco was born at Becchi, in Peidmont, Italy on August 16th 1815. From a very young age, he had decided that he had been called to work for the poor boys of that era when Europe was under the grip of the Industrial Revolution and many young people who came to the cities to study or in search of work fell an easy prey to the many social evils of the time. After being ordained a priest of the Catholic Church in 1841, Don Bosco came to the rescue of these poor youth with his novel method of education through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems.

To ensure that his total dedication to their cause shown through his actions, he based his education on the three great principles of reason, fear of God and loving kindness. He dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco was attuned to the needs of his society. He did not visualize education in isolation from the community within whose parameters it functioned. Vocational guidance, Skill enhancement training, job placement and follow-up were as integral to Don Bosco's scheme of things as they are in modern education.

The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is popularly known as the Don Bosco's Pedagogical System, which is based on three pillars: Reason, Religion and Loving Kindness. This is the system that will be used in Don Bosco College, Golaghat. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love, it is the method of Don Bosco". ## CAMPUS CULTURE

The College follows the system of education developed by St. John Bosco, which is widely known as the preventive system of education, based on reason, love of God, loving, and kindness. Don Bosco College, Golaghat prepares students to live their lives in abundance and at the same time to be of service to humanity, leaving a mark in the society where they live. The College begins from 9 a.m. with morning assembly and ends at 4 p.m. Every week each department is allotted the responsibility to conduct the assembly. The assembly begins with the morning prayer, followed by the presentation of news headlines, motivational talks, and other necessary information. Students come in proper uniform and Identity Cards. Every student is issued a regularity card where fees, leave record and disciplinary matters are noted. Speaking of English language is mandatory in the college campus. The use of mobile phones is partially prohibited during the college hours.

## DISCIPLINE

The Principal invites the co-operation of the students and their guardians in the creation and the maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to academic and cultural development, and in upholding the traditions of the institution. Students are especially invited to cooperate, in their own interest with their elected Class Representatives to ensure enforcement of rules regarding discipline.

### **Codes of Conduct in Classroom and College Premises - Do's and Dont's.**

1. Students must be punctual and regular in attending assemblies, classes, tutorials, class tests, examinations etc.
2. Impersonation during roll call is a punishable offense.
3. Use of Mobile Phones is prohibited on campus except at the designated places.
4. Resorting to any kind of malpractices (copying, impersonation, use of unfair means, exchanging answer sheets) during examinations is strictly prohibited.
5. Students should carefully follow the Notices put up on the Notice Board (both online and offline). No excuses are considered if Notices on the Board are ignored.
6. When an assistant professor is absent or is unable to take a class, students should maintain a strict order among themselves so as to not disturb the adjoining classes. Under no circumstances should they leave the classroom without ascertaining the relieve orders from the appropriate authority.
7. Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both teaching and non teaching and their fellow students with courtesy both in and outside the College. Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution.
8. Students must wear and display visibly their Identity Cards at the gate while entering the College and always wear it during College hours & inside the campus.
9. Students are not allowed to loiter or stand in the verandas or corridors of the College during class hours.
10. Students are forbidden from inviting friends from other institutions and outsiders to the College.
11. No posters are to be pasted or fixed with cellotape anywhere on the College walls. Any writing, scribbling on the walls will attract disciplinary measures against the student.

12. Smoking, chewing and spitting tobacco products or pan masala, consumption of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited inside the college premises. Violation of this rule will invite disciplinary action. The college premises is a smoking free zone, respect it.
13. Students must refrain from mishandling and tampering with library books or college computer systems.
14. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule. It is mandatory for all students and guardians to sign an affidavit in the pro forma prescribed by the Dibrugarh University related to ragging.
15. Students need to develop the quality of sustainable use of available resources including water, electricity etc.
16. Students must be committed to maintaining Green and clean Campus and associated ideas and values like promoting environmental awareness programs and eco clubs etc.

### DRESS CODE

1. Students shall wear the prescribed uniform on all days from Monday to Saturday unless otherwise permitted
2. Students shall always keep dignity and decency in dressing even though they are exempted from wearing
3. Violation of the dress code may result in denial of admission to classes/office/labs/library/meetings/ and
4. Even if there are no regular classes for a particular section of students due to examinations, study leave, etc. they shall be in full uniform on campus if it is a regular working day for other students.
5. Students suffering from health issues are permitted to wear jackets above the uniform ; however permission needs to be sought.
6. Such jackets shall be black in colour and shall not have big writings and pictures on it.

## UNIFORM

Sky Blue Shirt, Black Trousers, Black Belt, Black Neck Tie, Black Shoes and Black Socks. (Applicable for both boys and girls). **STUDENT IDENTITY CARD:** A non-transferable Identity Card, containing relevant information of the holder with recent photograph duly attested by the Principal, is issued to each student. The student is encouraged to wear his/her identity card attached to a fastener inside the college campus.

## **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION**

**To be eligible for Don Bosco College four year UG Programme**

- (1) Students who have passed 10+2 Examination in Arts, Science and Commerce Streams conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.
- (2) Students who have completed higher secondary education (10+2) or equivalent examination from a recognized board such as AISSCE, ICSE, CBSE, CISCE, NIOS and State Boards across India.

## DOCUMENTS NEEDED FOR ADMISSION

- (a) Passport size photo (soft copy, size - 10 kb to 500 kb)
- (b) Signature (soft copy, size -10 kb to 500 kb)
- (c) Caste Certificate
- (d) Domicile Certificate/PRC (If Possible)
- (e) ID Proof (Aadhar/Voter ID/PAN Card, etc.)
- (f) Transfer Certificate
- (g) Migration Certificate (Other than AHSEC)
- (h) Class X marksheet
- (i) Class XII marksheet
- (j) Income Certificate (If Possible)

## EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- (a) The College follows the pattern of examination and evaluation as per the Dibrugarh University. four year UG Programme 40% marks for internal assessment & 60% marks for End semester examination in each course.
- (b) There will be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End semester examination in each course during every semester for CBCS System & Non-CBCS System.
- (c) There is a provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the End semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny/re-evaluation.
- (d) Internal Assessment: In internal assessment, various tools may be employed such as written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses. (ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessments. Students shall compulsorily attend in the process of internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination. A student cannot repeat In-semester examinations.

(e) End Semester Examination: There is one End Semester Examination carrying 80% or 60% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End Semester Examination is normally through a Written/Laboratory-based Examination/Project Work or Dissertation.

(f) Examination in charge makes the necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the Sessional, Model End Semester Examinations.

(g) Normally, the End Semester Examination for each course is of two-hour/three-hour duration. The University guidelines says that a student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-Semester Examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. The University may grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons on recommendation of the Principal/Director/Coordinator of the Department/ Centre, on payment of the prescribed fee(s). The Principal of the College with the recommendation of the Heads of the Departments shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End Semester Examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfillment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same to the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch.

## ABOUT THE DEPARTMENTS



### DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The Department of Education at Don Bosco College Golaghat was established in the year 2016 with the aim of providing quality education to the students of Golaghat, North East India and other parts of India. 


## CENTRAL LIBRARY - DON BOSCO COLLEGE

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## COLLEGE INTERNSHIP

### Community Engagement

Under community engagement students can engage themselves with different communities with a specific purpose to work with identified groups of people, either connected by geographic location, special interest, or affiliation to a particular social identity and address issues affecting their well-being. The students are required to submit field-based report based on their work on issues related to Sociological importance that may cater the community's need and aspiration also. **Their engagement with the community may take place at the following levels:-**

- **Community Building:** Under this model, students conduct research to assess or meet community needs.
- **Community Education:** They can educate or generate awareness in the community regarding any important social issues.
- **Community Organizing:** With the aim of bringing positive change, they can engage community people into a process where people are brought together to address the issues that affect their communities. This can occur in geographically, psychosocially, culturally, spiritually, and digitally bounded communities.
- **Deliberative Dialogue:** This is a guided conversation on a political, cultural or social topic initiated by students. This model of conversation will be initiated by students by simply asking the community participants to investigate specific solutions to an issue through the help of a guide and facilitator. This group process will help the students to integrate and interpret scientific and contextual data for the purpose of informing several developmental related issues to the community.
- **Direct Service (People):** This may include volunteering or cleaning up a community park, public space etc. Service may also take place in the form of fundraising or collections for the fulfilment of a particular community need.
- **Direct Service (Product):** This may include giving personal time and energy to address immediate community needs. Examples include tutoring, serving food at a shelter, refugee camp, building or repairing homes, and donating cloths, food items to the flood affected people etc.
- **Economic Development:** Students can go into a community and can try to understand issues such as unemployment, lack of affordable housing, or the lack of sufficient retail and other services, through projects that are planned and implemented by institutions either at governmental or non-governmental level with community involvement. Or they can spread awareness and engage themselves in the process of Find Ways to Generate Local Revenue.
  - Create Jobs and Entrepreneurship Opportunities.
  - Support Local Events, Artists and Tourism.
  - Helping the community leaders to Build Stronger Management Systems.
- **Community Engaged Research:** Community engaged research is a process where students can derive input from people who will be impacted by the research outcomes and involve such people or groups as equal partners throughout the research process.
- **Community Engaged Learning:** Students can adopt this teaching and learning strategy that integrates meaningful community partnerships.




