26th May 2021: As part of the 3-day series of Webinar organised by Don Bosco College Golaghat, 2021 in collaboration with Marian College, Kuttikkanam, Kerala. The platform of the webinar was ZOOM meeting and all zoom platform and YouTube live process which was taken care by Technical team Ms Lalita Osga, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science and Deonish Tirkey. It was conducted with two technical sessions. The first technical session was well started off as per the scheduled time 10.30 AM. The first session came to an end at around 11:40 AM. It was followed by the second technical session starting from 11:45 AM.

The title for the 3rd day Webinar was “Gendering Covid Pandemic”. The proposed topic for the first technical session was “Impact on Women Reproductive Health”. Ms. Upasana Handique, Assistant Professor, Don Bosco College, Golaghat conducted the first session as the moderator. Dr. Rupakjyoti Borah, the Professor and Dean, School of Social Sciences, Kaziranga University was the resource person for this session. In the beginning of the session she introduced Dr. Borah with the participants present.



It was followed by the valuable speech delivered by Dr. Borah. He highlighted on problems and effects of lockdown on women reproductive health and its feasible solution. Regarding Pandemic he stated the laxity on the part of govt of almost all the countries for the sudden spread of Corona. He noted the present guideline of Govt, where all the new patients of any of the diseases have to go for compulsory corona test before being admitted in govt hospital. Regarding solution to the present problems he insisted on the roles of Govt to provide support to the needy people. The measures suggested by him to the victims were —to visit a doctor, mass



vaccination, caring attitude, sharing the burden from lots of household work and official work. During question hour before the end of the session, he answered to a number of questions put by different participants.

The second session was well started off at around 11:45 AM. Ms Arpita Duarah, Assistant professor of Don Bosco College, Golaghat introduced Syeda Ahmed, UNICEF, and State Consultant in Social Protection for Women and Children for the second session. The proposed research topic for the session was "Crime and Violence against Women during the Pandemic". As resource person for the session she focused on the gender specific violence during the pandemic. She focused on four specific questions in front of the participants for the purpose of discussion. The specific question she put before the participants were

Have you ever experienced Gender based violence?

Have you inflicted Gender based Violence on anyone?

Have you ever intervened in a situation on Gender-Based violence?

Is there a Difference in the way women and man experience violence?

She narrated Gender based Violence basically on women as physical, sexual, psychological, emotional, irrespective of place of occurrence whether private or public. She also stated that during pandemic the rate of eve teasing, sexual or marital violence had increased. In this regard, she upheld the crime statistics report of Ministry of home affairs released in the year 2015 with respect to women and children. Apart from these she discussed on different forms of violence like , silent domestic crime committed by not giving food to the victim, controlling her movement and creating fear to affect physically, mentally and emotionally. During her presentation she also shared one video on Gender-based Violence. For the present domestic violence she attributed to stress, uncertainty, unemployment, and frustration among the women especially.

It was followed by the Valedictory Session. The chief guest for this Session was Dr. Harry Cleetus. The valedictory function was conducted by Anjan Bharali, Assistant Professor, Don Bosco College, Golaghat. He extended his gratitude to all the members associated with the 3-day webinar. He shared some clippings of photographs of student achievers in the session. Finally, with the grand appreciation of the principal to the entire organising group, members and participants the 3-day series of Webinar came to an end.
